It could not be presented and defended in the student's mother tongue.

PLANNING

A list of available topics for developing the master's project will be published by the academic supervisors in due time.

Students are expected to proactively contact the academic supervisors and agree with them on the topic to develop in their master's project.

Learning System and Methodology / Contingency Plan of Adaptation to Scenarios A and B

Methodology and training activities will vary depending on the characteristics of the Project, but usually include (among others):

- Bibliographic search and analysis
- Market/ Industry / Contex fieldwork research
- Strategy and Information Analysis
- Improvement propositions and recommendations
- Academic writing and presentation

Contingency plan: The methodology will be the same in Scenario A (On-site training) and Scenario B (Distance training).

COMPETENCY ASSESSMENT

Criteria and Assessment Tools / Contingency Plan of Adaptation to Scenarios A and B

An evaluation committee assesses the master project according to the official rules of the University of Almeria and the specific requirements of the master. The final grade of the master's project is granted by the evaluation committee.

The master's project should have the previous approval of the supervisor before its presentation and defense in front of the evaluation committee.

The supervisor must complete a report assessing and detailing the master's project process developed by the student, check for plagiarism, and suggest a final grade for the master's project. This report - and this rating – is not binding, although it may be taken into account by the evaluation committee when deciding the student's final grade.

Contingency plan:

In the event of health restrictions, and following the recommendations of the authorities, teaching might be developed online. In this scenario, we will follow the same evaluation criteria, except for:

- The defense may be carried out in a telematic way.
- Students are exempt from the delivery of the 3 hard copies of their work.
